Ladies and Gentlemen

Good Evening. Thank you for joining us at the Singapore Red Cross' 48<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting.

While the latest easing of restrictions brings Singapore closer to normalcy, the social and economic repercussions of the pandemic will no doubt continue to linger and unravel other vulnerabilities in our community. We have our work cut out for us, but I am heartened that through this period, we have had the steadfast support of our partners, donors and volunteers who stood in solidarity with us amid the challenging times.

- Second, we must strengthen our existing programmes to increase our reach amongst the vulnerable in Singapore. Our programmes meet niche needs in our society. Now we must be able to extend these services to more in the community who need them.
- Third, we need to forge stronger and more diverse coalitions, rallying partners in the social sector, public agencies and the business community, as one united force for humanity. With our broad humanitarian mission, I am convinced that

the Singapore Red Cross is uniquely positioned to contribute as a coordinator and integrator for the community.

We are grateful that you have chosen the SRC as your preferred organisation to be a part of in your own humanitarian journey to do good. We must work together to continue mobilising additional resources, financial, expertise and time to intensify and expand our support for vulnerable communities in Singapore, regionally and globally. Working together as members, volunteers and staff of SRC, we will continue to strive to build empowered, responsive and resilient communities, well into the future.
